After School Enrichment Program Guidelines

Please read all information carefully and keep for future reference.

REGISTRATION

Class sizes are limited, so please register early to guarantee a space for your child and avoid disappointment. Enrollment is on a first-come, first-served basis.

The spring ASEP semester begins January 9 and ends May 18. ASEP classes are not held the week of Spring Break or on any day the children are not in school. Refer to the class descriptions for a few classes that span both the fall and spring semesters and for notice of any other dates when classes will not be held for an individual class.

REGISTRATION DEADLINE

Registration must be completed by Tuesday, December 19, 2017. Online registration will be closed at this time.

BILLING

The Business Office will send you a bill for the class and any additional supply fees. Please do not send payment with your registration form.

REFUNDS

If The Post Oak School cancels a class, you will receive a full refund. If you withdraw your child from a class after the first class, you will receive a full refund minus a \$15 cancellation fee. After the second class you will receive a 50% refund. Thereafter no refunds will be given for withdrawal from the class.

MAKE-UPS

In the event that a class is canceled by the school, a make-up class will be scheduled. Parents will be notified by email or phone as soon as possible of such cancellations.

STUDENT CONDUCT

Students enrolled in ASEP classes have the opportunity to interact with various members of the Post Oak faculty and with specialists from outside the school. The behavioral expectations of all ASEP students are the same as those of the regular school day. Please refer to the *Family Handbook* for more details.

DISMISSAL

All ASEP classes will dismiss on Avenue B at the end of the scheduled class. If your child will not be attending their ASEP class, please inform the teacher 24 hours in advance.

Art—Ceramics

(UPPER ELEMENTARY)

Upper Elementary students will learn different techniques for working with clay and making ceramics!

Chess

(LOWER & UPPER ELEMENTARY)

Wednesdays 3:30–4:30 p.m.

Chess is a classic game of strategy, invented more than 1,500 years ago in India. Chess is also a teaching tool that stimulates children's minds and helps them to build skills while enjoying themselves. As a result, they become more critical thinkers, better problem solvers, and more independent decision makers. This class is open to both beginning and experienced chess players at all levels.

Chinese Mandarin—Beginning

(LOWER & UPPER ELEMENTARY)

This class is designed for beginning students and those with minimum exposure to Mandarin. The class will build basic language skills and oral interaction skills. (UPPER ELEMENTARY)

Join us to practice basic, fundamental computer skills. In this class, you will learn how to go to a website address, compose emails, format a document, and use Excel and PowerPoint. Students will also learn how to type using proper form and then practice typing skills using their Typing Pal account.

Coder Kids

(LOWER ELEMENTARY)

Mondays 3:30–4:30 p.m.

This class gives students the opportunity to learn computer science fundamentals by creating fun games and animations as they learn to code. When students program computers, they have fun, engage their minds, and prepare for future careers. Coder Kids uses intuitive platforms to challenge students in weekly projects. Students will begin their coding experience by learning logic through games, apps, and basic coding challenges. Later they will move into Scratch and learn how to program their own simple animations and games on the computer.

Coder Kids

(UPPER ELEMENTARY)

Fridays 3:30–4:30 p.m.

This class gives students the opportunity to learn computer science fundamentals by creating fun games and animations as they learn to code. When students program computers, they have fun, engage their minds, and prepare for future careers. Coder Kids uses intuitive platforms to challenge students in weekly projects. Students will learn the fundamental skills behind computer programming in Scratch, from simple loops to conditionals to boolean logic. They will create games and animations on the computer with a range of complexity from easy to hard. This class moves at a fast pace and has many challenging elements.

Cooking

(LOWER AND UPPER ELEMENTARY)

Thursdays 3:30–4:30 p.m.

Let's travel around the world together, in the kitchen! Ms. De Leon will guide the children in preparing foods from countries all over the world. From Fettuccine Alfredo to fried plantains with cream, and so much more! During class, students will practice measurement and volume, talk about where each dish originates, the types of spices used, and participate in the preparation and clean-up of the meal. Skills learned will enable the students to prepare simple dishes at home for the family. This class also includes some crafts projects. Meals made will offer both vegetarian and non-vegetarian choices. Knowing any dietary restrictions prior to the beginning of classes will be helpful to Ms. De Leon in her planning.

(UPPER ELEMENTARY)

Fridays 3:30–4:30 p.m.

This class offers Upper Elementary students an exciting opportunity to apply math concepts and skills in solving real-life challenges! Hands-on activities and practical applications in a series of interdisciplinary, interesting, and challenging activities will help students discover how much math surrounds us every day. This enrichment class will help bring about a genuine appreciation for the importance and innovative use of math applications, provide a field of exploration and discovery for the students, and will help them realize the relevance and scope of mathematics in a varied and enjoyable way. This class provides the answer to the question students frequently ask, "Why do I have to learn this when I am never going to use it?"

Engineering for Kids

(UPPER ELEMENTARY)

Mondays 3:30–4:30 p.m.

Two courses in one semester! Engineering is everywhere! For half of the semester students will explore engineering in new, hands-on STEM learning lessons every week from various engineering disciplines. Each lesson has students focus on developing problem solving, critical thinking and peer collaboration skills using the Engineering Design Process. The other half of the semester will be VEX IQ Robotics Academy! This robotics platform is designed to be simple and easy for students new to robotics, yet flexible and powerful enough to allow for a wide range of exploration in all aspects of STEM. A variety of gears, wheels and other assemblies allow for complete mechanical customization of VEX IQ robots. There will be programming challenges using Robot C (based on the computer programming language C).

Engineering for Kids

(LOWER ELEMENTARY)

Two courses in one semester! Engineering is everywhere! For half of the semester students will explore engineering in new, hands-on STEM learning lessons every week from various engineering disciplines. Each lesson has students focus on developing problem solving, critical thinking and peer collaboration skills using the Engineering Design Process. The other half of the semester will be an Intro to Programming. Students will be introduced to coding and programming skills by designing and developing simple and fun video games using laptops and MIT's Scratch programming software.

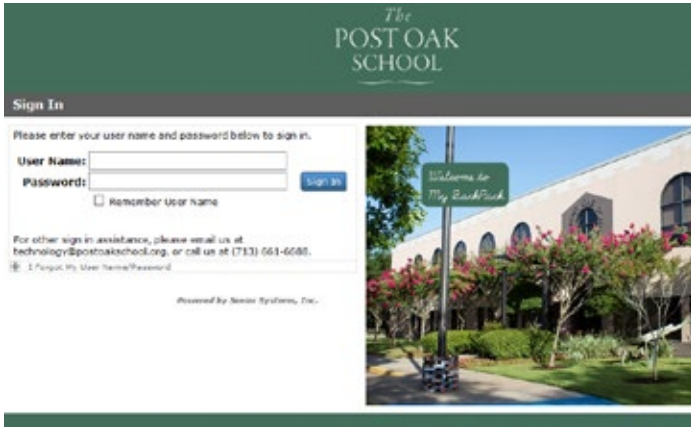

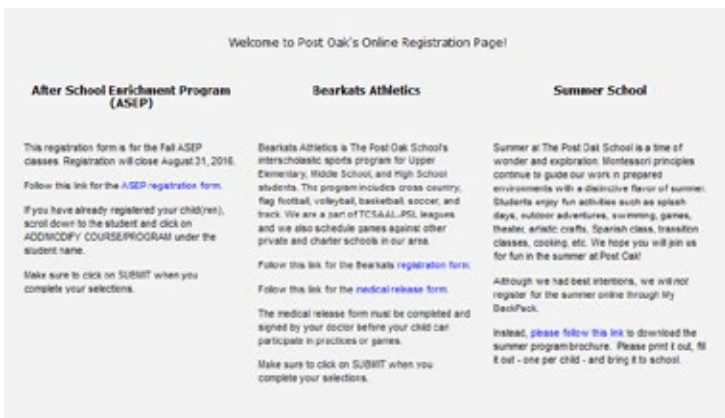

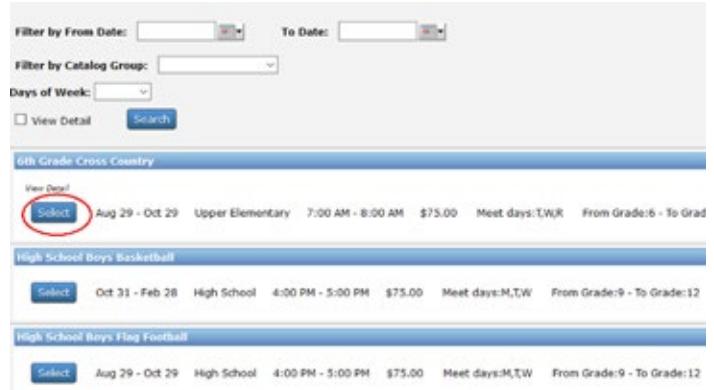
